Resident Story – Johanna Toews

I was born at Chickasha, Oklahoma on November 30, 1931 to Nathaniel and Hannah (Schmidt) Zieset. We lived in an old farmhouse on a red hill (Oklahoma dirt is red!). Cotton picking was a family job – before I was old enough to help, I remember hopping on the gunny sack and getting a free ride in the cotton fields. I helped with picking cotton together with by 10 brothers and sisters: Leah, Daniel, Frances, Martha, Mary, Earvey, John & Jake who were twins (Jake passed away at age 4 from diphtheria), Nina and Nathan. I liked being alone, but my sister Nina liked to follow me around. I attended the Sandlin school and enjoyed going to school through the 8th grade. We milked cows by hand. Before marriage I helped with the harvest in California. Also, I was a nurse aid for 6 months at Bethel Home in Newton, Kansas. Then at age 21, I married Franklin Toews from Inman, Kansas on December 7, 1952. I then worked as a nurse aid at Mercy Hospital here in Moundridge and also at St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Hutchinson, Kansas. Franklin was in the CPS service in Topeka, Kansas – while living there I helped with laundry at the hospital in Topeka and later at the Grace Hospital in Hutchinson. I even worked as a CNA here at the Moundridge Manor. We had five children – Judy & Jacob who have both passed away; John (Maxine), Barron, Wisconsin; Geraldine (Steve) Nolt, Mifflinburg, Pennsylvania; and Joyce (Ray) Peachey, Moundridge, Kansas. We have six grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren. I enjoyed gardening and often I would have a plant or two rooting in water on the window sill. I was an outdoor person and loved to go out in the morning – whistling and singing while I worked. Also, I enjoy reading and love to hear the old Christian Hymnal songs. Some of my favorite foods are sweet potatoes, tomatoes, vegetables and chocolate pudding and cake. I loved to dry mint for hot tea and still like hot water, hot tea or hot chocolate to drink. I like to be warm and cozy and love my cozy blankets, long socks and my pink India scarf. I have learned to be happy with what I have. I moved here to the Manor on January 4, 2021.
