
ACTIVITY INFORMATION

You will receive <u>18 tickets</u> each week to spend on Manor Store items beginning the week of June 7. Also, you will receive tickets for activities <u>attended</u>.

For activity requests you may come to the **Activity Office at the back of the Activity Room** or call the Activity Office at (620) 345-6364, ext. 305.

We have resumed once a month shopping for resident requests from Wal-Mart on the first Monday of each month so plan accordingly. The next shopping day has been changed to <u>Friday</u>, <u>July 2</u>, <u>2021</u> due to Monday, July 5 being the 4th of July holiday.

Dining has resumed in the Courtyard Café and Sunshine Diner without social distancing. Group exercises and activities may be held without social distancing and masks if all present are fully vaccinated. Visitors may have in-room and outdoor visits by appointment. The Manor is in regular communication with your primary representative and keeping them informed of all developments. McPherson County recommends the following beginning May 20, 2021: Individuals that have been fully vaccinated for at least 2 weeks do not need to wear masks or distance (unless in a healthcare setting like a hospital). Businesses may continue to be more stringent in both private and public situations at their discretion.
