The watermelons were Black Diamonds from St. John, Kansas purchased at the local grocery store. Roll kuchen or 'rolled cookies' are a Dutch treat that was traditionally eaten with watermelon – the crispy, salty, fried fritter is wonderful with the sweet, cold watermelon! Math was a favorite subject in the classroom. On May 5, 1968, I married Martha Jean Wenger at Hesston, Kansas. Our first home was just west of Galva. Soon we moved to Martha's home place, the F.H. Wenger farm. The Gospel congregation, Moundridge, Kansas became our place of worship. We had 4 children and 1 foster daughter. Shana Joy married Anthony Koehn (Uvalde, Texas); Anthony Allen (passed away in a farm accident); Bonita Joy married Ryan Benner (Faunsdale, Alabama); and Grant Allen married Crystal Holdeman (Bowersville, North Georgia). Foster daughter, Marie, married Jason Miller and they are presently serving in Cambodia as missionaries, Marie's homeland. Also, we enjoyed having a foster brother and sister, Dave & Sue Beachy, in our home for a number of years. In 1972 we moved to the Louisville, Georgia area, attending the Pinecrest congregation. Together in a business partnership with Jay Nikkel's, we as a family spent many hours farming and dairying. Martha and the children were good help. It was here that Allen was ordained to the deaconry. After 18 years in the Louisville area, North Georgia became their home for the next 20 years. Allen and Martha together with Carl Dyck's had the privilege of starting the Bowersville, Georgia congregation. Here they put up chicken barns, growing broilers. Many enjoyable hours were spent working together as a family. The beautiful Georgia mountains were an inviting retreat when a vacation was needed! Woodworking is another hobby that is enjoyed. I and Martha recently made the move to Moundridge, I to join the Moundridge Manor community and Martha to a residence on Main Street.
