# Resident Story – Eugene & Joyce Toews

Eugene was born to Abraham and Priscilla (Wiebe) Toews on March 27, 1938, at Wales, North Dakota. He had 4 brothers and 3 sisters. Eugene attended a small country school. Spelling was a favorite subject. He grew up on a farm helping with farm chores. He enjoyed when family got together for butchering day. He went to boy's preparatory class in Tucumcari, New Mexico, and later to Kansas City where he spent 2 years at KU Medical Center in 1W service. On December 1, 1957, while still in service he married Joyce Schmidt from Halstead, Kansas. She was the daughter of Abraham and Esther (Esau) Schmidt. Joyce was born in Dalhart, Texas, on January 4, 1937. Joyce was 4 years old when her family moved back to Halstead. She grew up helping on the family farm helping with chores and fieldwork with her four sisters and one brother. One of her memories of school is one time when the teacher left the room some of the big boys started fighting. As a small girl that really frightened Joyce. Before she married Eugene she worked at Millie's Café, a small but quite well-known café in Halstead. After her marriage on December 1, 1957, she moved to Kansas City with Eugene until he got out of service. In 1958 they moved to Hutchinson, Kansas, where Eugene worked at Big Chief Manufacturing making steel buildings. In 1959 they moved to a place in the country close to Halstead where they had chickens and sold eggs. In 1971 they again moved, this time to Grafton, North Dakota, where Eugene managed a grain elevator and farmed. They raised potatoes for seed, wheat, barley, beans, and corn. Later he worked for the county grading roads and running the snow plow in the winter. Joyce was a housewife and mother. She worked one school term as an aid at school and she worked at Sunset Home in Grafton for one year. Joyce's hobbies were china painting and reading and Eugene's hobbies were repairing clocks and watches, woodworking, and reading. They had several foster children live with them. They spent six months in Rocky Mountain and Princeville, North Carolina, as house parents for a boy's unit rebuilding after flooding caused by a hurricane. They were in Cherkasy, Ukraine, for five months working at the tract office answering letters, and thirteen months in Riga, Latvia doing tract work. Then they spent twelve months doing mission and tract work on the island of Grenada in the Caribbean. They have traveled to Mexico, England, Barbados, Ghana, Haiti, Dominica, Lithuania, Poland, and Estonia. Their children are: Gary (Elda) Burns, Kansas; Randell (Bonnie) Livingston, California; Bruce (Susan) Grafton, North Dakota; and Travis (Juliann) Grifton, North Carolina. They have thirty-five grandchildren (counting grandchildren and their spouses) and twenty-two great-grandchildren. They lived at Pine Village awhile before moving to Moundridge Manor on July 20, 2021. Both Eugene and Joyce continue to enjoy reading. Eugene enjoys setting jigsaw puzzles and doing genealogy research – he still plans to write his own life story in more detail!

# **ACTIVITY INFORMATION**


