Resident Story - Mary Renno

Mary Renno was born to Eli and Hettie (Peachy) Renno on April 2, 1955, at home at Bellville, Pennsylvania. She was the second oldest in a family of ten. Her siblings are Nancy (Earl) Nolt, Jake (Liz), Dorothea, Rhoda Johnson (deceased), Linda Heller, David (Susan), Clara (Daniel) Johnson, Sara, and Lorraine. Her family moved to McVeytown, Pennsylvania, when she was about four years old. She attended first through third grades in McVeytown public school, in fourth grade she went by school bus to Strodes Mill, then in fifth through eighth she attended an Amish School at Bellville. Her family carpooled with some of their aunts and uncles. Sylvan Yoder was her seventh and eighth grade teacher. She remembers picking blackberries with her family and finding an area with a lot of berries, when her mother called, she didn't answer because she didn't want to share her bountiful patch with anyone. Her parents had a truck garden so helping in the garden was a summer time job. They had a large strawberry patch, one day she remembers they picked 98 quarts of strawberries. She also remembers going with her family and an aunt to Long Island Beach in New Jersey. Her first job away from home was cleaning houses for other people and she worked as a kitchen aid at Valley View, a care home in Bellville. She spent six months of voluntary service at the Bannatyne Home for children with disabilities in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada. While there she would often spend her days off with friends at Rosenort and Steinbach. In 1985 she came to work at the Moundridge Manor as a CNA. She worked here for thirteen and a half years. During that time, she took a leave and went to California to spend six months at Little Blessings, a short-term foster care home for children. While she was there, they gave shelter to around eighty different children. She also spent six months in Mexico being house help for George and Marcia Nichols. George's sister Margaret and her husband Ward Unruh took her to Mexico. She remembers Jared (Manor maintenance supervisor) had his 5th birthday on that trip. In 1998 Mary went home to McVeytown and worked for Capitol Home Care going to a number of homes. She helped one couple daily from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. They became very fond of each other. Then in 2015 she moved back to Kansas and came to work in the housekeeping department at the Manor. She lived at Northridge several years. In 2019 she moved to Pine Village and in July of 2021 she moved to the Moundridge Manor. She says, "I love it here!" Right now, she is piecing a quilt using blocks she had cut for quilts she made previously. She likes to crochet. While at Pine Village she crocheted "Honor Shawls" which were given to people that had lost a family member. She also made some items to sell while at Pine Village. After coming to the Manor she has started an afghan. She also likes to read or listen to audio books in her spare time.
