SCRIPTURE CAKE

This recipe is from Jan's cookbook, Sharing Recipes. It encourages Bible reading, and if correct ingredients are chosen from the references given, they will make a good cake.

4 ½ cups of 1 Kings 4:22

1 cup of Judges 5:25

2 cups of Jeremiah 6:20

2 cups of 1 Samuel 30:12

2 cups of Nahum 3:12

2 cups of Numbers 17:8

2 teaspoons of 1 Samuel 14:25

1 teaspoon Leviticus 2:13

6 of Jeremiah 17:11

½ cup of Judges 4:19

2 teaspoons of Amos 4:5

2 teaspoons of II Chronicles 9:9

Bake slowly in a moderate oven. Follow the directions for any basic fruit cake. **HAPPY HUNTING!**

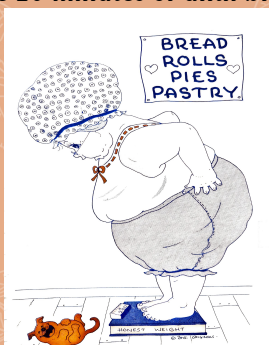
Topping:

¼ cup margarine

1 cup brown sugar

½ cup evaporated milk

Bring to boil, remove from heat. Add ½ box of flaked coconut, ½ cup nuts, 1 teaspoon vanilla. Spread on hot cake and bake 10 minutes or until brown.

A Tribute to Janice Cozart September 21, 1940 – October 23, 2021

This is a tribute to Janice Cozart, a Manor resident for almost 40 years, who passed away on October 23, 2021 after a long battle with Multiple Sclerosis. She moved to the Manor on May 13, 1982. Here she was an inspiration to both staff and residents with her ability to cope with a warm smile, quick wit and positive attitude. In her earlier days of living at the Manor she compiled a cookbook entitled Sharing Recipes which is a collection of her personal favorites, 'Manor' favorites from the dietary department, and recipes from staff and residents at that time. Some of these recipes are still being used today at the Manor – such as Cornbread, Green Bean Soup, Bierocks, Pumpkin Bread, Pluma Mousse and Carrot Cake. Jan liked to go outside to read and sit in the sunshine on nice days. She was an excellent speller and would usually win any Spelling Bee she participated in. Her love of music was evident by the enthusiasm with which she sang at Manor Sing-A-Longs. Also, since she enjoyed bowling she liked to come and participate in the weekly exercise games – which showed her competitive side. In later years, after her boys married and left home – she was remembered at her birthday with a box of flowers arriving in the mail and by her family with a picture display of her boys, spouses and grandchildren. Her husband, Ken, in years prior took her to church services at the United Methodist Church and home for Sunday dinner. In later years, he still faithfully came to visit and kept a bowl stocked with candy in her room for the nurses. Soon after the Covid-19 pandemic began, Jan's family sent an iPad and she enjoyed many FaceTime visits with her two sons, Kenneth and Craig, and their families. Jan is surely an example for us all of enduring with grace the hand that is given in life. May her life serve as an inspiration for us to live our lives as this quote states "Life, for most of us, is getting used to the things we hadn't expected." This is the way Jan lived...and endured. She will long be remembered by the Manor community for her contribution to the daily life of the Manor for these many years. She will be missed!
