H for harvest stored away, home, and hearth, and holiday.

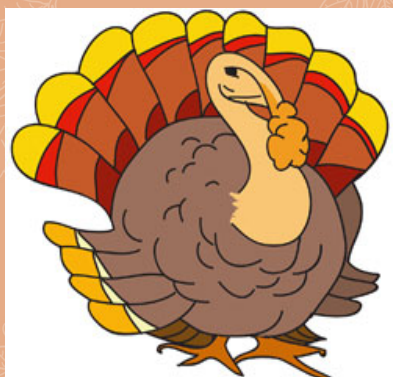
A for autumn's frosty art, and abundance in the heart.
