CMS Releases New Visitation Guidance

On Friday, November 12, CMS (Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services) issued a memo eliminating most restrictions on visitation in long-term care nursing homes! CMS required doors to be locked to public access in March 2020 at the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic. Here are some of the highlights from the memo:

- Visitation is now permitted at any time for all residents, regardless of vaccination status, nursing home outbreak status, or implementation of transmission-based precautions.
- Nursing homes may no longer require scheduling, limit number of visitors, limit length or frequency of visitors, or limit number of overall visitors in the nursing home at one time.
- Large gatherings continue to be discouraged, and all must continue to adhere to core infection control principles. This includes masking and social distancing, if unvaccinated, which is recommended or required within certain parameters.
- Group dining, group activities, and resident outings are generally permitted provided core infection control principles are followed.

However...nursing homes still need to implement infection control practices regarding visitation, i.e. hand hygiene, screening, wearing masks and social distancing if unvaccinated, etc. All visitors are required to continue screening for symptoms of Covid-19 and temperatures will continue to be taken before visitation occurs. Currently, masks are required at all times during visitation regardless of vaccination status (due to McPherson County being in the red zone for high community transmission of Covid-19). Visitation is to take place in resident rooms or a designated visitation area. Visitors are not to loiter in hallways. If more people are visiting than your room can accommodate other arrangements are encouraged to be made in Moundridge Manor encourages visitors to come during advance. Hospitality Service hours of Monday – Friday 1:00-7:00 p.m.; Saturday 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. and Sunday 2:00-5:00 p.m. if at all possible. Please continue to enter the Manor at the West Entrance on the west side of the building. There will be a Hospitality Aid to assist you during the above listed times otherwise Manor staff will assist you, as needed. Electronic screening options are being pursued. Hopefully, this is one more step in returning to 'normal' operations in nursing homes around the nation!
